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August Is Tree Check Month: Help Spot the Asian Longhorned Beetle

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August is Tree Check Month.

August has been declared [Tree Check Month](#) by USDA's Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service (APHIS) to encourage everyone to inspect their trees for the invasive [Asian longhorned beetle](#) (ALB).

Why August Matters

Now is prime time to spot ALB. Adult beetles are about 1 to 1½ inches long, shiny black with white spots and long black-and-white striped antennae and they are active this month! The larvae feed inside trees, and adults emerge through round exit holes, about the thickness of a pencil, leaving sawdust-like frass behind. Infested trees cannot recover and become safety hazards as branches can fall and trees may topple.

What To Look For

Check hardwood trees you love, especially maples, birches, elms, willow, ash and poplar, for these telltale signs:

- Adult beetles on tree trunks, leaves or branches
- Round exit holes, ~¾ inch across
- Egg sites or chewed bark spots with sap weeping
- Frass, coarse sawdust, piled around tree bases or crevices
- Dying or dropped branches in otherwise healthy trees

What You Can Do

1. Inspect your trees and those in neighborhoods, parks, or recreation areas.
2. Don't move firewood or wood from quarantined areas because ALB can spread easily this way.
3. Report any suspected beetles or damage immediately. You can take a photo (or freeze a specimen in a sturdy container) and call APHIS's toll-free hotline at 1-866-702-9938 or submit an [online report](#).

APHIS is eradicating ALB from [quarantined areas](#) in Massachusetts, New York, Ohio and South Carolina. Early detection helps save our trees, forests, protects property
