


**Look for the beetle on

LOOK FOR THE **SIGNS**


You can see the adult ALB from June through October—but you can spot the signs year round!



Adult ALB




Round exit holes




Egg sites on bark



Frass (wood shavings) on bark or at tree base



Larvae in chopped wood



Pupae in chopped wood



Don't move firewood—you could be moving the ALB.
