Certification Statements:

1. The United States of America or the state of origin is officially free of Notifiable Avian Influenza, Newcastle disease and other notifiable avian diseases.
2. Psittaciformes (parrots) originate from a facility that has not reported any cases of avian chlamydiosis for 12 months prior to exportation.
3. The birds have been under supervision of an officially-accredited veterinarian 3 weeks before shipment and showed no signs of any communicable disease during that period.
4. The birds will be inspected by an officially-accredited veterinarian within 24 hours of export. An addendum certifying the completion of this examination, finding no clinical evidence of communicable diseases, will be made on the letterhead of the officially-accredited veterinarian and affixed to the endorsed health certificate.
5. The birds are individually identified by a ring or chip.
6. The birds will be transported in new unused containers.

This certificate is valid for 14 days after issuance.

Additional Information:

The department of Veterinary Affairs must be warned by the freight forwarders and/or customs at least 48 hours before the scheduled flight, so that the shipment may be inspected on arrival. Birds that do not comply with the aforementioned certification requirements or show any symptoms of any communicable disease will be euthanized immediately.
