Certification Statements:

I, the undersigned USDA Accredited Veterinarian, certify to the following statements:

1. The animals for export were visually examined prior to loading, showed no signs of any contagious diseases, and to the best of my knowledge they were not exposed to infectious agents of diseases of concern.

2. There have been no occurrences of unexplained mortality events in the premises of origin of the animals for export during the 30 days prior to shipment.

3. There have been no cases of OIE-listed aquatic diseases in susceptible species from the population of animals for export during the 30 days prior to shipment, including epizootic hematopoietic necrosis (EHN), epizootic ulcerative syndrome (EUS), Gyrodactylosis salaris, infectious hematopoietic necrosis (IHN), infectious salmon anemia (ISA), koi herpesvirus (KHV), red sea bream iridoviral disease (RSIVD), salmonid alphavirus (SAV), spring viremia of carp (SVC), and viral hemorrhagic septicemia virus (VHS).

4. The container/packaging in which the animals for export are transported is either new or has been cleaned and disinfected prior to use.
