

**CONDITIONS FOR THE IMPORTATION OF DAY OLD CHICKS/ HATCHING EGGS INTO
SAINT LUCIA**

1. The breeding flocks were raised on farms located in a county free from Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza (HPAI), Low Pathogenic Avian Influenza (LPAI) and Newcastle Disease as defined by the World Organization for Animal Health (OIE) within the past 21 days.
2. Breeding flocks originate from farms that are not under quarantine for any disease and are located no less than 30km away from any affected farm or flock.
3. The hatching eggs or chicks must be accompanied by a health certificate signed by the Veterinary Authority of the respected country stating that:
 - a) The eggs, wrappings and containers have been inspected and are free from particulate matter, cracks, flies and other extraneous substances.
 - b) Chicks selected are of first class quality and vaccinated against Merek's Disease.
4. In addition there should not have been any clinical abnormalities in the breeding flock (s) from which these eggs were derived, within 48 hours of egg collection.
5. The breeding flock (s) and their parent flock (s) must be registered and/or officially recognized and in good standing with the statutory authority of the country of origin of these hatching eggs or day old chicks.
6. The flock (s) must be certified, tested and/or free of the following disease:

Infectious Bursal Disease (IBD)	Pasteurellosis
Avian Encephalomyelitis (AE)	Merek's Disease (MD)
Complicated CRD (colibacillosis mycoses)	Infectious Reovirus
Adenoviral Infections	Chlamydiosis
Infectious Bronchitis (IB)	Salmonellosis
Infectious Laryngotracheitis (IL)	Avian Influenza (AI)
Chronic Respiratory Disease (CRD)	
7. Where, the parent flocks, hatching eggs or day old chicks are tested, treated or inoculated, the dates type of test employed, treatments and vaccines used must be certified, stated and communicated to the Veterinary Authority, prior to the granting of an import permit.
8. The eggs or chicks must be landed at Hewanorra International Airport or George F L Charles Airport or the Seaport of Castries and Vieux Fort.
9. The eggs or chicks and their accompanying documents must be examined by an approved representative of the Veterinary and Livestock Services Division before they are released to the Importer.
