

CHECKLIST FOR CATEGORY C1

All of the listed steps need to be completed in order to qualify for this category. If your pet cannot meet all of the following requirements, your pet may undergo quarantine for up to 120 days.

Step 1 RABIES VACCINATIONS

- My pet has a regular and valid rabies vaccination programme.
- Under the regular and valid vaccination programme, rabies vaccination was administered
 - Not more than the manufacturer's vaccine label duration prior to arrival in Singapore; (i.e. Not more than 12 months prior to arrival in Singapore for a 1-year rabies vaccine or; Not more than 36 months prior to arrival in Singapore for a 3-year rabies vaccine or; Not more than 48 months prior to arrival in Singapore for a 4-year rabies vaccine.)
 - Not less than 30 days before my pet's date of arrival in Singapore.
- My pet had an additional rabies vaccine administered at least 30 days after the last vaccination of the vaccination programme and at least 12 months prior to export.

Two rabies vaccinations are required. The pet's most recent rabies vaccination in the valid vaccination programme must not have expired when your pet arrives in Singapore. Following the most recent rabies vaccination, animals must have not moved out of the country and must have stayed in the country for not less than 6 months or since birth.

Step 3 RABIES ANTIBODY TITRE TEST

- A rabies antibody titre test was carried out at least 1 month after my pet's last vaccination in the valid vaccination programme, and within 6 months of my pet's arrival in Singapore.
- This rabies antibody titre test was carried out before administering the additional rabies vaccination
- The result of my pet's rabies antibody titre test was greater than or equal to 0.5 IU/ml.
- I have a copy of the rabies antibody titre test result showing my pet's microchip number.

Step 4 DOCUMENTS – VACCINATION CERTIFICATES

- I have the original signed copy of the rabies vaccination certificate with the label from the vaccine bottle attached for the two most recent rabies vaccinations my pet received.
- The vaccination certificate has the vaccine name, lot or serial number, booster interval, vaccination date and expiration date listed.
- The vaccination certificate bears the identification code of the microchip that has been implanted in my pet
- The vaccination certificate bears the details (name of the veterinarian, name and address of veterinary practice) and endorsement of licensed/registered veterinarian who vaccinated my pet and verified the microchip identification code.

Step 5 RESERVATION OF QUARANTINE SPACE

- I have sent in my 'Reservation for Quarantine of Dogs and Cats' form to AVA more than 3 months prior to the date of my pet's arrival in Singapore.
- I have received confirmation from AVA that a quarantine space will be available for my pet on the day it arrives in Singapore.

Step 6 SUBMISSION OF DOCUMENTS

- I have applied for an import licence online on the AVA website.
- I have attached copies of my documents (rabies vaccination certificates/vaccination records showing the vaccination that is part of the regular vaccination programme as well as the additional vaccination (compulsory), rabies antibody titre test result (if available at the time of application)etc.) when I applied for an import licence on the AVA website.
- I have attached the forms 'Application and Acceptance of Quarantine Space' (parts a, b and c) when I applied for an import licence on the AVA website.
- I have attached a photograph of my dog showing clearly the face and body if it is a cross/mixed breed.

NOTE! Do not send documents in separately. Send all documents in a set.
Do not send original documents to AVA.

Step 7 VETERINARY CERTIFICATE

- I have an original veterinary certificate in English in accordance with the template attached to the veterinary conditions for the import of dogs and cats from countries under Category C that was dated not more than 7 days prior to arrival in Singapore including rabies vaccine name, booster interval, vaccination date and expiration date
- The veterinary certificate states my pet at was examined by the registered veterinarian and found to be healthy, free from any clinical sign of infectious or contagious disease and fit for travel at the time of export
- The veterinary certificate states my pet was at least twelve (12) weeks of age at the time of export.
 - In the case of a dog: My dog was vaccinated at least once not less than 2 weeks and not more than 1 year for a vaccine with a 1 year validity or based on manufacturer's recommendations prior to export against Canine Distemper, Canine Hepatitis and Canine Parvoviral Infection;
 - In the case of a cat: My cat was vaccinated at least once not less than 2 weeks and not more than 1 year for a vaccine with a 1 year validity or based on manufacturer's recommendations prior to export against Cat Flu (Feline calicivirus and Feline viral rhinotracheitis, and *Chlamydomphila felis*) and Cat enteritis (i.e. Feline Panleukopaenia / Feline Infectious Enteritis).
- My vet has treated my pet with a product effective against external parasites (fleas and ticks) between 2 and 10 days of export and the active ingredient and date of treatment will be stated clearly in the health certificate.
- My vet has treated my pet with a product effective against internal parasites (nematodes and cestodes) within 4 days of export and the active ingredient and date of treatment will be stated clearly in the health certificate.
- The veterinary certificate will be endorsed by the competent veterinary authority of the country of export.

Step 8 OTHER

- I understand that my pet will have to be quarantined in Singapore for at least 10 days.
- My pet has not traveled to countries from Category D for the past 6 months.
- If my pet has resided in countries from Category D in the 6 months preceding the date of arrival in Singapore, I understand that my pet will be

- imported under the veterinary conditions of Category D and will be quarantined for at least 30 days on arrival in Singapore.
- I understand that my pet will have to be quarantined in Singapore until the rabies antibody titre test result are available, if the results are not available by the time my pet arrives in Singapore.
 - I have applied for an import licence of my pet that is dated not more than 30 days prior to its arrival in Singapore.
 - My pet will not be pregnant at the time of export.
 - I have informed Changi Animal and Plant Quarantine of my confirmed flight details 5 days prior to my pet's arrival in Singapore.
 - My pet will be traveling to Singapore in a container that conforms with IATA regulations.

CHECKLIST FOR CATEGORY C2

All of the listed steps need to be completed in order to qualify for this category. If your pet cannot meet all of the following requirements, your pet may undergo quarantine for up to 120 days.

Step 1 RABIES VACCINATIONS

- My pet has a regular and valid rabies vaccination programme.
- Under the regular and valid vaccination programme, the most recent rabies vaccination was administered
 - Not more than the manufacturer's vaccine label duration prior to arrival in Singapore; (i.e. Not more than 12 months prior to arrival in Singapore for a 1-year rabies vaccine or; Not more than 36 months prior to arrival in Singapore for a 3-year rabies vaccine or; Not more than 48 months prior to arrival in Singapore for a 4-year rabies vaccine.)
 - Not less than 30 days before my pet's date of arrival in Singapore.

The pet's most recent rabies vaccination must not have expired when your pet arrives in Singapore. Following the most recent rabies vaccination, your pet must not have moved out of the country or if it has moved, has only moved within countries in either Category A, B or C for at least 6 months prior to export or since birth.

CHECKLIST FOR CATEGORY C3

All of the listed steps need to be completed in order to qualify for this category. If your pet cannot meet all of the following requirements, your pet may undergo quarantine for 120 days.

Step 1 RABIES VACCINATIONS
