U.S. Exports of Day-old Chicks, Hatching Eggs, and SPF Eggs to Taiwan Originating from a State not considered by Taiwan as an HPAI-Free Zone

- 1. The following process applies to United States origin day-old chicks, hatching eggs, and SPF eggs (further referred to as "poultry") that originate from States that have been removed from Taiwan's Animal and Plant Health Inspection Agency (APHIA) "List of Infectious Animal Disease-free Countries (Zones) and Bovine Spongiform Encephalopathy Risk Status" document of HPAI free zones.
- 2. This process is valid from April 29, 2022 until December 31, 2025 unless modified by APHIA and notified to APHIS.

Obtaining an Import Permit:

US exporters will need to provide the following information:

- a. USDA accredited veterinarian attestation letter with the following statement:
 "Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza, in poultry as defined by WOAH, has not occurred within a 10 km radius of the establishment for at least 28 days prior to export."
- b. Example (picture and/or complete description) of the seal or sticker that will be placed on the container of animals prior to leaving the hatchery/farm that will not be removed until arrival in Taiwan.

Health Certificate:

A modified health certificate, indicated in the title as "[Temporary]" that indicates the HPAI status of the establishment will be issued by a USDA accredited veterinarian and endorsed by APHIS with the temporary HPAI language.
