## IMPORT HEALTH REQUIREMENTS OF TRINIDAD AND TOBAGO FOR DAY OLD DUCKLINGS FROM THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA

The animals must be accompanied by a U.S. Origin Health Certificate issued by a veterinarian authorized by the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) and endorsed by a Veterinary Services (VS) veterinarian. The certificate shall contain the name and address of the consignor and the consignee. Additional certification shall include:

## **CERTIFICATION STATEMENTS**

- 1. That flock or flocks of origin are free from infection with Duck Viral Enteritis, Duck Viral Hepatitis, Reimerella anatipestifer and Salmonellosis.
- 2. The hatchery or hatcheries of origin are free from evidence of communicable diseases.
- 3. The flocks and farms from which the birds originate were not located under quarantine restrictions for Newcastle Disease or Avian Influenza.
- 4. The flocks and farms from which the birds originate were not located under quarantine restrictions for Newcastle Disease or Avian Influenza.

## ADITIONAL REQUIREMENTS

- 1. The ducklings must be newly hatched and not fed or watered.
- 2. The ducklings must be presented for entry in new, clean containers.
- 3. An import permit is required.
- 4. The animals are transported directly from the country of origin to Trinidad.

## OTHER INFORMATION

- 1. The Division of Veterinary Services reserves the right to retain samples for testing
- 2. The Division of Veterinary Services reserves the right to refuse entry of the entire shipment, if conditions are not in accordance with those stipulated above.
- 3. The ducklings will not be released to the Consignee, until they have been examined by an Inspector of the Animal Health Sub-Division, Ministry of Agriculture, Land and Marine Resources and found to have satisfied the conditions stated above.
