No controlled commodity may be imported into the Islands unless an animal import permit has been issued under this Part; the controlled commodity meets the animal import conditions of the permit and of and under this Ordinance; and the controlled commodity is accompanied by any other documentation required by or under this Ordinance or any other written law to accompany imports. PERMISSION IS HEREBY GRANTED TO IMPORT THE FOLLOWING CONTROLLED COMMODITIES INTO THE TURKS AND CAICOS ISLANDS SUBJECT TO AND UNDER THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS:

- That the controlled commodities are accompanied by an **INTERNATIONAL SANITARY CERTIFICATE** or the specific certifying document agreed upon between the exporting country and the Turks and Caicos Islands attesting that all import conditions pertaining to the controlled commodities have been met;
- The consignee must ensure that the controlled commodities meet and comply with all requirements, where applicable, from any other regulatory body that may have responsibility for this import;
- That the shipments of the controlled commodities must be distinctly identified and linked to the apposite controlled commodities on this import permit;
- That all required documents (including this import permit, the original of the international sanitary certificate, laboratory test results, *inter alia*) accompany the consignment of the controlled commodities at the port of entry;
- That the consignee gives the Inspection Unit for Plant and Animal Health at least 48 hours' notice of confirmed arrival date, time, airline/vessel number and the name of designated port of entry;
- That all imported controlled commodities must be presented for inspection by Animal Inspectors of the Animal Health Services Division; and
- The controlled commodities meet all the existing sanitary requirements of the Islands at the time of arrival at the port of entry.
