

Facility Registration Requirement of Argentina
Bovine Hides and Skins, Bovine Tallow and Yellow Grease and Similar Commodities of Bovine
Origin

As part of the requirements of Argentina for the importation of animal products, SENASA requires that exporting facilities have applied for and been approved as a registered facility, prior to the issuance of any import permits. This is a one-time registration requirement for each new facility and for the commodity type.

The manufacturer must submit a process document (monograph) that attests to the processing parameters for the commodity. SENASA requires that this process document be countersigned by a competent regulatory authority.

For certain commodities, including bovine hides and skins, bovine tallow, and restaurant (yellow) grease, APHIS VS may be able to facilitate this process by countersigning the process document when the following conditions have been met:

- The document attests only to processing parameters similar in simplicity and format to those outlined below.
- The VS Area veterinary official has knowledge of the processing referred to in the process document, through a previous inspection by an Area veterinary medical officer within the previous 12 months. Further, the Area office has on file a manufacturer's affidavit attesting to the requirements in the approved certificate.
- The process document presented by management of the facility is signed by the management or supervisory official of the plant who is directly responsible for carrying out the process referred to below.

Bovine hides and skins

"Skins are trimmed in the fresh state and then wet salted in a process including the following steps:

They are soaked in a salt solution (saturated sodium chloride).

A second application of salt is made during stockpiling.

Salt-treated hides are loaded on to pallets prior to export."

Bovine tallow and yellow grease

"The raw materials are cooked at a temperature to remove the fat from the protein content.

The product was treated at a temperature of not less than 60°C for not less than 10 minutes.

The maximum content of insoluble impurities in tallow does not exceed 0.15 percent by weight."

If the Area veterinary official has determined that these conditions are met, the signing official may countersign the process document.

The signature block should be prepared under a statement “I have read this manufacturer’s statement and have no reason to doubt its validity.”
