- 7) The animal products or by-products covered by this certificate do not contain any of the following tissues of any bovinae² animals: the skull, brain, trigeminal ganglia, eyes, palatine tonsils, spinal cord and dorsal root ganglia of bovinae² animals aged 30 months or older; and the distal ileum of bovinae² animals of all ages
- 8) The raw inedible products will be transported in a manner intended to prevent contamination and/or leakage of the products;
- 9) The raw inedible products or by-products have not been exposed to or comingled with any animal-origin materals that do not meet the requirements of this certificate;
- Shipping containers and all accompanying documentation are marked with the words "INEDIBLE" AND:a) The name of the animal species for which the product/by-product is intended and the words "Food" or "Aliments pour." OR
 - b) The word "CONDEMNED" OR
 - c) "For medicinal purposes" or "for pharmaceutical purposes"
- 11) The products or by-products have either:
 - a) been denatured OR
 - b) have NOT been denatured as the nature of the commodity is not likely to be mistaken for an edible product
- ¹ Diseases of concern for Canada for animal products & by-products covered by this certificate are:
- For avian species including poultry: Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza, Newcastle disease
- For ruminants: Contagious bovine pleuropneumonia; Foot-and-mouth disease (FMD); Lumpy skin disease; Peste des petits ruminants; Rift valley fever and Sheep pox and goat pox;
- For swine: African swine fever; Classical swine fever (Hog cholera); Foot and Mouth Disease; Swine vesicular disease;
- For Horses &other equids: African horse sickness and
