

Export to Indonesia: Fish and fishery (aquatic) products, including artemia cysts, for purposes other than human consumption

This information pertains to fish and fishery products intended for purposes other than human consumption. This information does not apply to any live aquatic commodities (except for artemia). The referenced certificate covers artemia cysts (eggs) but may not be appropriate for frozen artemia. Exporters shipping frozen artemia should confirm acceptability of the certificate prior to shipping.

Facility Approval Process

Establishments producing aquatic products for export to Indonesia must be inspected and approved by APHIS Veterinary Services (VS) prior to export and annually to maintain approval to export. Please contact your [pertinent VS Service Center](#) for more information regarding the APHIS inspection and approval process. This inspection is required for VS to verify statements a, c, and d on the letterhead certificate.

Export Certification Requirements

1. Use the fillable letterhead certificate “HEALTH CERTIFICATE FOR FISH AND FISHERY PRODUCTS EXPORTED TO THE REPLUBLIC OF INDONESIA” available on the main Indonesia IREG page. The issuing VS office will print the certificate on security paper as is, and NOT transfer to local VS office letterhead. The endorsing official should sign all pages of the certificate.
2. Leave the “Certificate Number” and “Date” blocks at the top of each certificate page, as well as the last section on page 2, “Certified Details”, blank as the VS office endorsing the certificate will complete these sections.
3. Complete all other applicable sections of the letterhead certificate. If assistance is needed, please contact the local VS office that will be endorsing the export certificate.
 - a. In the “Attestation” section on page 2, select the checkbox next to “fishery products” or “other” as appropriate [note that “fishery products” should apply to most shipments]. The pre-selected checkboxes in a, c, and d should not be altered. Statement d applies to product intended for animal consumption (“non-edible” means not intended for human consumption in this case).
 - b. The “Additional Information” section may be used to add information that did not fit in an earlier section. No laboratory testing results should be added to this section. If this section is left blank, either enter “N/A” or draw a line through the box.
