

Specified Risk Material (SRM) Certification for Italy

If exporting animal byproducts accompanied by Regulation (EC) 1774/2002 certificates:

Italy requires the following SRM certification for most imported animal-byproducts imported under Regulation (EC) 1774/2002. If exporting with a Regulation (EC) 1774/2002 (as amended) certificate, the following pages should be added to the pertinent Regulation (EC) 1774/2002 certificate prior to submission to your local Veterinary Services Area Office for endorsement.

If exporting animal byproducts accompanied by Regulation (EU) 142/2011 certificates:

Regulation (EC) 1774/2002 certificates may only be utilized until November 30, 2011 (for shipments entering the EU prior to January 31, 2012). Regulation (EU) 142/2011 certificates will be required thereafter. If using a Regulation (EU) 142/2011 certificate, the below additional pages are not required and may not be utilized. APHIS does not endorse Regulation (EU) 142/2011 certificates if the below pages are added to the certificate. For information on which Regulation (EU) 142/2011 certificates are currently available for endorsement by APHIS, please return to the [European Union](#) page.

If exporting “raw material” for the production of gelatin or collagen for human consumption:

These exports are not covered by Regulation (EU) 142/2011. The “Specified Risk Materials Certificate” must be the last pages of the primary certificate. (For more information on the primary certificate, please return to the [European Union](#) page.)
