

Mexico - Important information regarding trade bans and other restrictions

Poultry products:

Poultry products that have not been heat treated from the State of Indiana are ineligible / banned with an effective date of May 14, 2015.

Poultry products that have not been heat treated from the States of Iowa, North Dakota, and Wisconsin are ineligible / banned with an effective date of April 15, 2015.

Poultry products that have not been heat treated from the States of Montana and South Dakota are ineligible / banned with an effective date of April 6, 2015.

Poultry products that have not been heat treated from the State of Kansas are ineligible / banned with an effective date of March 17, 2015.

Poultry products that have not been heat treated from the States of Arkansas and Missouri are ineligible / banned with an effective date of March 12, 2015.

Poultry products that have not been heat treated from the State of Minnesota are ineligible / banned with an effective date of March 6, 2015.

Poultry products that have not been heat treated from the State of California are ineligible / banned with an effective date of January 27, 2015.

Poultry products that have not been heat treated from the States of Arizona, Idaho, Nevada, Oregon and Washington are restricted effective January 27, 2015. An additional certification statement pertains to testing the flock of origin and presentation of negative test results.

Rabbit products:

Mexico SENASICA advised on April 23, 2010, that until further notice, animal products from rabbits are restricted unless they have received an appropriate treatment to inactivate rabbit hemorrhagic disease virus.
