

Important Information Regarding Trade Ban Status

or any product not covered by those as detailed on the IREGs or if a product is thought to be related to any restriction as detailed below, it is recommended the U.S. exporter have their Taiwanese importer check with Taiwan's Bureau of Animal and Plant Health Inspection and Quarantine (BAPHIQ) to confirm the their product(s) will be permitted entry into the country and obtain the appropriate Taiwanese (C.C.C. Code) Classification, if applicable, prior to shipping.

I. Bovine Spongiform Encephalopathy

Despite the U.S. being recognized by the World Organization for Animal Health (OIE) as negligible risk status for Bovine Spongiform Encephalopathy (BSE), Taiwan does not officially consider the United States to be negligible risk thereby prohibiting the importation of numerous commodities from the U.S.

For more information on those bovine-origin products exempted from this restriction, please refer to specific commodities as noted in the pertinent IREG on the previous page. If a product is not listed, it is recommended the U.S. exporter have their Taiwanese importer check with Taiwan's Bureau of Animal and Plant Health Inspection and Quarantine (BAPHIQ) to confirm the their product(s) will be permitted entry into the country and obtain any appropriate import requirements prior to shipping.

Taiwan has verified there are NO BSE-based prohibitions on the following commodities:

- Dicalcium phosphate (protein-free and oil/fat-free);
- Gelatin and collagen derived from the skins of cattle, goats, or sheep;
- Milk products;
- Hides and skins;
- Hydrolyzed feather meal.

II. Notifiable Avian Influenza (NAI)

Taiwan currently considers the following States to be affected by *highly pathogenic avian influenza* (HPAI): **None.**

Taiwan currently considers the following States to be affected by *low pathogenicity notifiable avian influenza* (LPNAI): **None.**

Poultry meat (cooked or uncooked), meat products, egg products and table eggs derived from birds slaughtered or processed in the above States must be produced and shipped in accordance with effective dates below and may not transit States currently under restrictions unless sealed. This prohibition is not believed to apply to commodities certified by APHIS, other than Table Eggs as noted in the pertinent IREG on the previous page.

Current Eligibilities:

- **Delaware** – Poultry meat and meat products derived from birds slaughtered on or after July 5, 2014, is eligible for export to Taiwan.
- **Michigan** – Poultry meat and meat products derived from birds slaughtered on or after January 2, 2016.
- **Missouri** – Poultry meat and meat products derived from birds slaughtered on or after July 31, 2016.

Important Information Regarding Trade Ban Status

- Poultry meat and meat products derived from birds slaughtered on or after February 22, 2016 from the following states: **Oregon, Washington, Idaho, California, Minnesota, Arkansas, Kansas, South Dakota, Montana, North Dakota, Wisconsin, Iowa, and Nebraska.**
- **Indiana** – Poultry meat and meat products derived from birds slaughtered on or after September 23, 2016.
- **Pennsylvania** – Poultry meat and meat products derived from birds slaughtered on or after September 28, 2016.
- **New York** – Poultry meat and meat products derived from birds slaughtered on or after October 6, 2016.
- **New Jersey** – Poultry meat and meat products derived from birds slaughtered on or after October 10, 2016.

Current Ineligibilities:

- None listed.

III. Exotic Newcastle Disease (END)

Taiwan currently considers the following States to be affected by END: **None.**

Poultry meat (cooked or uncooked) and meat products derived from birds slaughtered or processed in the above States must be produced and shipped in accordance with effective dates below and may not transit States currently under restrictions unless sealed. This prohibition is not believed to apply to commodities certified by APHIS, other than Table Eggs as noted in the pertinent IREG on the previous page.
