

CUSTOMER AID FOR LIVE DOG IMPORT PERMIT APPLICATIONS ENSURE ALL OF THE FOLLOWING ARE TRUE:

- I am the importer and/or applicant and am responsible for the accuracy and completeness of the application and associated documents.
- ... I am submitting my application at least 5 business days prior to the proposed date of arrival.[★]
- The DELIVERY RECIPIENT entered on the application is the person or group to whom the dogs will be delivered in the U.S. and is the physical address, where the dogs will initially be housed, after arrival into the USA (no PO Boxes or mailing addresses are permitted).
- On my eFile application, I have uploaded health certificates and rabies vaccination certificates for each dog (APHIS 7041 is recommended).
 - o Rabies vaccination certification may be included on the same document as the health certificate.
- I have read and reviewed all my uploaded documents, and all the information matches what I entered on the application.
- 🔟 All dogs will be at least 6 months (180 days) of age by the proposed date of entry as documented on the health certificate. **
- The name and address of the IMPORTER is on all uploaded documents, and it matches the name and address I entered for the IMPORTER on the application (physical or mailing address is permitted).
- → The VETERINARIAN who examined the dogs and issued the health certificates and rabies vaccination certificates:
 - Is licensed in the country of export (license number must be included on all certificates);
 - Signed and dated all certificates, using a consistent date format that is clear (MMM/DD/YYYY) first three letters of month spelled out and,
 - o Issued the documents in English.
- ☐ The rabies vaccination certificate* shows the following:
 - A rabies vaccination was given at least 30 days prior to date of entry; **
 - The dog was at least 3 months (12 weeks or 84 days) of age at the time of vaccination; and,
 - The most recent vaccination will expire after the date of arrival.
 - If there is no expiration date for the rabies vaccination, it will be considered to expire 12 months from the date it
 was administered.
- The health certificate shows the following:
 - Distemper, Hepatitis (Adenovirus), Leptospirosis, Parvovirus, and Parainfluenza (DHLPP) vaccinations were not administered more than 12 months before the date of arrival; **
 - The name and manufacturer of the DHLPP vaccine;
 - The dog is in good health; and,
 - The dog will be at least 6 months (180 days) of age by the date of arrival. **
- The breed, color, sex, age, and other identification (such as name, microchip, or tattoo if applicable) entered for each dog on the application matches the information on all uploaded documents.
 - Use "Other" in the breed look-up field if the dog's breed is not listed. If the dog is a mixed breed select MIXED BREED and enter the breed description in the text field, so it matches what is on all other documents.
- The TRANSPORTER is the airline or ground transportation company, NOT the name of a person accompanying the dog(s) during transport.
- The port of export listed on the application is the original port of embarkation from the country of export, **NOT** the following:
 - A layover; or,

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- The port of entry.
- I used the port of entry's time zone for both the departure and arrival times on the application. (This prevents the arrival time being prior to the departure time which would cause an error in eFile that blocks moving to the next step of the application.)
- The travel itinerary listed on the application includes all segments of travel by AIR/LAND/SEA from the Port of Export within the country of origin, to the Port of Entry within the United States.

*Exceptions and expedited processing may be granted on a case-by-case basis, for emergency situations. **Exceptions to age and vaccination requirements may be granted for dogs imported for resale for research purposes or for veterinary treatment and subsequent resale, or for dogs imported into Hawaii from the British Isles, Australia, Guam, or New Zealand.
