





What's African swine fever?

African swine fever (ASF for short) is a disease that makes pigs sick. ASF is not dangerous to people, but it can really hurt pigs!

Some foods made from pork can carry ASF. Those foods are still safe for us to eat, but if we take them with us when we travel, we could spread ASF to more places.

Here are just a few things you CAN'T take with you:



How can you help stop the spread?

To keep more pigs from getting sick, it's important to not bring any pork with you when you travel. **So if a food has pork, leave it behind!** <



Find the foods made from pork!

Pretend you work at the airport, and it's your job to find foods that could carry ASF! Look in the suitcase and circle and color the hidden foods that are made from pork. Travelers won't be able to take those foods on their flight. How many can you find?






How many pigs are hiding?

Pigs have snuck into the airport! Count how many pigs are hiding so we can stop them from spreading ASF.


Hint: There are seven (7) pigs hiding!




Word Scramble

Here's a hint: Each word has something to do with food or traveling!


