Certification Statements:

I, the undersigned USDA accredited veterinarian, certify the following:

1. The donor was born and reared in the United States or was a continuous resident of the United States for six months prior to semen collection.
2. The semen was collected under the supervision of a USDA accredited veterinarian.
3. The microchip number or permanent identification of the donor was verified at the time of semen collection.
4. The donor animal did not show any signs of infectious diseases at the time of semen collection or during 30 days prior to and following semen collection.
5. The donor animal was normal upon testicular examination performed by the USDA accredited veterinarian on the day of semen collection.
6. The donor animal was vaccinated against parvovirus, distemper and rabies at least 30 days prior to semen collection with a USDA approved vaccine and was current on those vaccines at the time of semen collection.
7. The donor animal did not show clinical signs of brucellosis on the day of semen collection and was negative to a serologic test for *Brucella canis* conducted within 45 days prior to semen collection; and the donor animal was not used for natural breeding between the serologic test and the last semen collection.

11. The shipping containers used to transport the semen are either new or were cleaned and disinfected with approved products in the United States prior to loading, and were sealed by a USDA authorized veterinarian, with seal number noted in Box 18 of this certificate.
