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Certification Statements:

I, the undersigned USDA accredited veterinarian, certify to the following statements:

1. The United States is free of contagious bovine pleuropneumonia (CBPP) and foot and mouth disease (FMD).
2. The United States is recognized by the World Organization for Animal Health (OIE) as a country having a negligible risk status for bovine spongiform encephalopathy (BSE).
3. The state(s) of origin is officially free of brucellosis and tuberculosis.
4. The herd of origin has been free of clinical cases of bovine leukosis, infectious bovine rhinotracheitis, campylobacteriosis and trichomoniasis for the last 12 months prior to export.
5. The animals were isolated for at least 21 days immediately prior to export, in a facility approved by a USDA accredited veterinarian, and were inspected and found to be free from clinical evidence of communicable diseases.

TEST REQUIREMENTS:

The cattle for export must be tested within 60 days of export with negative results for the diseases listed below.

1. Tuberculosis: Intradermal test using bovine PPD tuberculin.

Brucellosis: Complement fixation test at a 1:10 dilution; OR buffered Brucella antigen test (i.e., card test); OR Enzyme-Linked Immunosorbent Assay (ELISA); OR standard tube test; OR Fluorescent Polarization Assay (FPA); OR plate agglutination test at a 1:50 dilution; OR other test accepted by USDA.
