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22. Zoosanitary Certification Statements:

I, the undersigned Official Veterinarian, duly authorized by the Government of Canada, hereby certify, after due enquiry and to the best of my knowledge and belief, that the animals described within this certificate meet the following requirements:

22.1 The animals were born in the United States or Canada or were legally imported into Canada and have been under no movement restrictions⁽¹⁾ within Canada or the United States for at least 60 days (or 90 days if from a region not considered free of foot and mouth disease by USDA APHIS) prior to importation into the United States.

22.2 The country*, region* or zone* of Canada from which the animals originate and are exported, is officially free, in livestock, without vaccination, from the following contagious diseases:

- 22.2.1 foot-and-mouth disease;
- 22.2.2 surra;
- 22.2.3 contagious pleuropneumonia

* In the event of regionalization or zoning decisions by Canada for one of the listed diseases in condition 22.1, the region or zone and use of this certificate for shipment of animals must be pre-approved by USDA- APHIS Veterinary Services prior to initiation of the pre-export isolation.

22.3 With regard to Transmissible Spongiform Encephalopathy (TSE) (i.e. scrapie):

- 22.3.1 TSEs in sheep and goats are compulsorily notifiable to the national veterinary authority of Canada.
- 22.3.2 An effective classical scrapie awareness, surveillance, monitoring, and control system is in place.
- 22.3.3 TSE-affected sheep and goats are killed and completely destroyed.
- 22.3.4 The sheep and goats selected for export showed no clinical signs of scrapie or other infectious disease on the day of shipment and are fit for travel.
- 22.3.5 The sheep and goats have not tested positive for, and are not suspect for, a transmissible spongiform encephalopathy.
- 22.3.6 The animals' movement is not restricted within Canada due to animal health reasons and
- 22.3.7 The date determined by APHIS a ruminant-to-ruminant feed ban was effectively enforced for the whole country was March 1/1999.

22.4 The female sheep and goats listed in this certificate are:

- 22.4.1 not known to be pregnant; and
- 22.4.2 are not visibly pregnant; and
- 22.4.3 have not been exposed to a sexually intact male over 5 months of age, nor to a sexually intact male within 5 months of shipment

22.5 Each animal is identified with official identification and this number is recorded on the health the certificate.

22.6 Each animal has EITHER:

- 22.6.1 a "CAN" tattoo in the left ear or tail web, or a "C" brand; ⁽²⁾ OR
- 22.6.2 the importing designated feedlot has been approved by APHIS to accept animals that have not been "C" branded or "CAN" tattooed prior to export. ⁽²⁾

22.7 I have inspected the sheep and goats for export, and their flock of residence within 30 days of export and found them free from infectious and contagious disease.

22.8 The animals for export have continually resided since birth in a brucellosis and tuberculosis free province or territory or in a brucellosis or tuberculosis free herd.

22.9 After due inquiry, I have determined to the best of my ability that the sheep or goats have not been exposed to any infectious or contagious disease during the 60 days immediately preceding shipment to the United States.

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<p>Notes:</p> <p>(1) Animals that were under movement controls or quarantine for investigation purposes, where the investigation has concluded, with no confirmation of the disease of concern for all animals within the herd of origin, and where all restrictions have been lifted by the CFIA, are not considered to have been "under restriction/quarantine" and are eligible for export the day that the CFIA releases them.</p> <p>(2) Strike out and initial inapplicable</p> <p><i>This certificate is valid for thirty (30) days after the date of inspection by the accredited veterinarian.</i></p>
