# Supplemental Health Certificate for the Temporary Importation of Foreign Origin Horses to the United States Under CEM Waiver (9 CFR 93.301(f))

This supplemental certificate applies to horses that qualify for entry under 9 CFR 93.301(f) and that have temporarily resided in a country which APHIS considers affected with contagious equine metritis (CEM), screwworm, Venezuelan equine encephalitis (VEE), and/or foot and mouth disease (FMD) in the 60 days immediately preceding export to the United States.

## V. Animal Health Attestations

I, the undersigned, certify that the horse described above meets the following requirements:

- a. The horse resided in the country specified above for (number) day(s).
- b. The horse described was inspected on the premises of temporary residency listed above on \_\_\_\_\_ (mm/dd/yyyy) and found to be free of contagious diseases and, insofar as can be determined, not exposed to communicable or contagious diseases immediately preceding exportation, or during the indicated period of residency.
- c. The horse has not been vaccinated with a live, attenuated or inactivated vaccine during the period of residency if within 14 days preceding exportation to the United States.
- d. Insofar as I can determine, African horse sickness (AHS), dourine, glanders, surra, epizootic lymphangitis, ulcerative lymphangitis, equine piroplasmosis, equine infectious anemia, contagious equine metritis (CEM), vesicular stomatitis, and/or Venezuelan equine encephalomyelitis has not occurred on the premises of temporary residence during the period of residency, nor have these diseases occurred on any adjoining premises during the same period of time.
- e. The horse was examined and found to be free of ectoparasites.
- f. APHIS recognizes the country of residency to be free of AHS.<sup>2</sup>

#### VI. CEM Attestations

a. During the indicated period of residency listed, the horse did not have any contact, breeding or otherwise, with horses from a premises affected with CEM or horses found to be affected with CEM.

# VII. Foot and Mouth Disease (FMD) Attestations:

a. APHIS recognizes the country of residency free of FMD.<sup>1,2</sup>

b. APHIS recognizes the country of residency to be affected with FMD and the FMD mitigations outlined in *Requirements for Horses that Reside in Multiple of Differing Health Statuses Prior to Exporting to the United States* have not been performed.<sup>1,2</sup>

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## **VIII.** Screwworm Attestations:

# IX. Venezuelan Equine Encephalitis (VEE) Attestations

b. APHIS recognizes the country of residency to be affected with VEE and the VEE mitigations outlined in *Requirements for Horses that Reside in Multiple of Differing Health Statuses Prior to Exporting to the United States* have not been performed.<sup>1,2</sup>

APHIS recognizes the country of residency as free of VEE AND the horse has temporarily resided in one or more countries that APHIS considers VEE affected AND the mitigations outlined Requirements for Horses that Reside in Multiple of Differing Health Statuses Prior to Exporting to the United States have been performed as certified on the attached certificate or addendum. <sup>1,2</sup>
