I, the undersigned official veterinarian, declare that I have read and understood Regulation (EC) No 1069/2009, and in particular Article 10 of that Regulation, and Commission Regulation (EU) No 142/2011, and in particular Chapter II of Annex XIII and Chapter II of Annex XIV thereto, and certify that the dogchews described above:
