

### Part III. Notes for completion

These notes for completion must be read and understood by the certifying officer before signing the certificate. Notes are set out in sections that correspond to the sections in the certificate. By signing this certificate, certifiers are verifying that the consignment meets the requirements set out in the certificate and any relevant corresponding notes for completion.

These notes do not need to be printed as part of a paper certificate that accompanies the consignment or in any electronic copy of the certificate.

References to European Union legislation within this certificate are references to direct EU legislation which has been retained in Great Britain (retained EU law as defined in the European Union (Withdrawal) Act 2018) and can be viewed on the UK legislation website (legislation.gov.uk).

References to Great Britain in this certificate include Channel Islands and Isle of Man.

References to GB requirements refer to the requirement(s) of Great Britain as set out in the accompanying notes for completion.

### Part I

- Box reference I.6: *Person responsible for the consignment in Great Britain*: this box is to be filled in only if it is a certificate for transit commodity; it may be filled in if the certificate is for import commodity.
- Box reference I.11 and I.12: *Approval number*: the registration number of the establishment or plant, which has been issued by the competent authority.
- Box reference I.12: *Place of destination*: this box is to be filled in only if it is a certificate for transit commodity. The products in transit can only be stored in free zones, free warehouses and custom warehouses.
- Box reference I.15: Registration number (railway wagons or container and lorries), flight number (aircraft) or name (ship) is to be provided. In case of unloading and reloading, the consignor must inform the BCP of entry into Great Britain.
- Box reference I.19: Use the appropriate Harmonized System (HS) code under the following headings: 05.05, 05.06, 05.07 or 97.05.
- Box reference I.23: For bulk containers, the container number and the seal number (if applicable) should be given.
- Box reference I.25: *Technical use*: any use other than for animal consumption.
- Box reference I.26 and I.27: Fill in according to whether it is a transit or an import certificate.
- Box reference I.28: *Nature of commodity*: select one or more of the following: [bones], [horns], [hooves], [claws], [antlers], [teeth], [hides] and/or [skins];  
*Species*: select from the following: *Aves*, *Equidae*, *Tapiridae*, *Rhinocerotidae*, *Antilocapridae*, *Bovidae*, *Camelidae*, *Cervidae*, *Giraffidae*, *Hippopotamidae*, *Moschidae*, *Suidae*, *Tayassuidae*, *Tragulidae* and *Elephantidae*.

### **AH/P708 Product requirements**

The declaration of the transporter for the dry-salted or wet-salted game trophies or other preparations consisting only of hides and skins should state that they will be transported by ship and the duration of transport will be such that they will have undergone a minimum of 14 days of salting before they reach the border control post of the point of entry into Great Britain.
