

Game Trophies of Animals other than Ungulates or Birds

I. Game trophies of ungulates and birds:

The European Union has harmonized requirements for the import of game trophies of ungulates and birds. For information on these requirements, please see the information available under the “[European Union](#)”.

II. Untreated or Partially Treated Game trophies of animals **other than ungulates or birds:**

Hungary requires the “ANIMAL HEALTH CERTIFICATE for game trophies of animals other than ungulates and birds intended for consignment to Hungary” for untreated or partially treated game trophies of animals other than ungulates or birds. [For access to this certificate, please go back to the previous screen].

This certificate may not be endorsed for finished game trophies that have been submitted to a complete taxidermy process. No APHIS certificate is required for finished game trophies that have been submitted to a complete taxidermy process. [CITES certification from the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service may be required.]

Prior to endorsement of the “ANIMAL HEALTH CERTIFICATE for game trophies of animals other than ungulates and birds intended for consignment to Hungary”, the processing/exporting facilities must have been inspected by APHIS Veterinary Services within the previous 365 days (to verify the contents of the certificate). For information on scheduling this inspection, please contact the [APHIS-VS Area Office](#) in the State where the game trophies will be processed or packaged for export.

The original of the certificate must accompany the consignment and must be endorsed both prior to export and within 10 days of arrival into Hungary (in the case of transport by sea vessel, the 10 days may be extended by the time of the voyage).

Exporters should separately contact the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service for information on the required CITES certificate. The number of the CITES certificate must be included on the “ANIMAL HEALTH CERTIFICATE for treated and untreated game trophies of animals other than ungulates and birds intended for consignment to Hungary” but does not become part of the certificate endorsed by APHIS.
