Certification Statements:

I, the undersigned USDA accredited veterinarian, certify to the following statements:

1. The United States is free of bovine babesiosis, contagious bovine pleuropneumonia (CBPP), foot and mouth disease, (FMD) rinderpest, and old worm screwworm.
2. The United States is recognized by the World Organization for Animal Health (WOAH) as a country with negligible risk of bovine spongiform encephalopathy (BSE).
 - a. The United States applies all measures according to WOA recommendations and complies with the conditions referred to in Chapter 11.4. of the WOA Terrestrial Animal Health Code.
 - b. The cattle selected for export are identified by a permanent identification system in such a way as to demonstrate that they are not exposed cattle as described in Chapter 11.4.
 - c. The cattle selected for export were born after the date from which the ban on the feeding of ruminants with meat-and-bone meal and greaves derived from ruminants was effectively enforced.
3. The animals originate from premises in which no clinical cases of anthrax, bluetongue, bovine genital campylobacteriosis or rabies has occurred for the 6 months prior to export.
4. The animals were vaccinated against leptospirosis, infectious bovine rhinotracheitis / infectious pustular vulvovaginitis (IBR/IPV), parainfluenza and other respiratory complex diseases (e.g., shipping fever) not less than one (1) month and not more than six (6) months prior to export.
5. The animals for export were isolated for at least 21 days prior to export in a facility approved by the USDA Accredited Veterinarian and examined for evidence of external parasites, injury and infectious diseases (including vesicular lesions, bovine brucellosis, anthrax, bluetongue, tuberculosis, rabies and enzootic bovine leukosis).
6. The cattle must be tested with negative results for the diseases listed below once during isolation, except for Tuberculosis (TB) where testing must be completed within 90 days of export:
 - a. Tuberculosis: Intradermal test using bovine PPD tuberculin, OR other test authorized by USDA.
 - b. Brucellosis: Complement fixation test at a 1:10 dilution, OR buffered Brucella antigen test (i.e., card test), OR Enzyme-linked immunosorbent assay (ELISA), OR standard tube test, OR plate agglutination test at a 1:50 dilution, OR fluorescent polarization assay, OR other test authorized by USDA.
 - c. Enzootic Bovine Leukosis: ELISA, OR Agar gel immunodiffusion (AGID), OR other test authorized by USDA.
7. Vehicles used for transportation will be cleaned and disinfected with chemicals
