Certification Statements:

I, the undersigned USDA Accredited Veterinarian, certify to the following statements:

1. The flocks and hatcheries from which the above-described hatching eggs originated were inspected by me or another accredited veterinarian within 30 days prior to shipment of above hatching eggs and found free from evidence of communicable diseases and insofar as can be determined have not been exposed to Newcastle disease, fowl plague (avian influenza), fowl typhoid, ornithosis, and pullorum disease.
2. During the usual routine inspection of the flock or flocks there was no visible evidence of communicable diseases observed on the inspection dates listed in box 14.
3. The National Poultry Improvement Plan classification is as indicated in table 21 above.
4. The prospective exporter has been advised that the hatching eggs must be clean and shipped in clean, unused packaging.
5. The hatching eggs and their parent flocks are located in a country, zone (county) or compartment free from notifiable avian influenza in poultry, according to the World Organization of Animal Health (WOAH).
6. The flocks and hatcheries of origin are free from clinical cases of avian Infectious Bronchitis (IB), Infectious Laryngotracheitis (ILT), and Fowl Cholera (FC).

NOTES: Compliance with International Air Transport Association (IATA) animal welfare guidelines must be maintained during shipment.

The Kenyan import permit (numbered provided above) must accompany the shipment along with this APHIS-endorsed export veterinary health certificate.
