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**Certification Statements:**

1. The country has been free from foot and mouth disease, rift valley fever, contagious bovine pleuropneumonia and haemorrhagic septicaemia for the past twelve (12) months prior to and till the date of export.

2 USA has been classified by the WOAHA as a country with negligible bovine spongiform encephalopathy (BSE).

3. The animals were kept for the 20 days prior to shipment in an establishment where no case of anthrax was officially declared during that period.

4. With regard to bovine genital campylobacteriosis, The animals are either

[O] are virgin heifers and/or bred by artificial insemination (AI).

[O] were kept in a herd in which no case of bovine genital campylobacteriosis has been declared; and which have been mated by natural cover, the culture of vaginal mucus for the presence of the causal agent of bovine genital campylobacteriosis proved negative.

5. The animals originate from a herd free from infection with M. tuberculosis complex and have been tested using tuberculin test for infection with M. tuberculosis complex with negative results within 60 days prior to shipment.

6. With regards the blue tongue disease, the animals were protected from attacks from Culicoides during quarantine and transportation. Animals were test negative with antibody tests or agent identification. Animals that test positive with antibody test, may be removed from the shipment or further test negative with an agent identification test.

7. The animals were subjected to a diagnostic test for bovine anaplasmosis with negative results during 30 days prior to shipment and were treated with an acaricide and, if necessary, a repellent against biting insects prior to shipment and were completely free of ticks.

8. The animals originate from a herd free from infection with Brucella and all sexually mature animals were tested for infection with Brucella with negative results within 30 days prior to shipment.

9. The animals were kept in a herd in which no case of trichomonosis has been reported; and for females which have been mated with natural cover, direct microscopic examination and culture of vaginal mucus or other testing method is negative.

10. The animals were derived from farm/premises where no case of bovine viral diarrhea were reported during the preceding twelve (12) months prior to export.

11. The animals shall be vaccinated against the following disease not more than one (1) month prior to export:

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- a) Infectious Bovine Rhinotracheitis
- b) Bovine Viral Diarrhea

12. With regard to Leptospirosis, the animals have been kept in a herd with no clinical cases and either

[O] were test negative Leptospirosis (L. hardjo, L. tarassovi (hyos) and L. pomona) not more than 1 month prior to export with titres less than 1/100

[O] were vaccinated not more than 1 month prior to export

[O] treated with intramuscular injection of long acting oxytetracycline (or other approved treatment of Leptospirosis) at a dose rate of 20mg/kg body weight (or as directed) within thirty (30) days prior to export

13. The animals have been treated for all external and internal parasites prior to export. The medication(s) \_\_\_\_\_ and date(s) \_\_\_\_\_.

14. The animals showed no clinical signs of above diseases and any other infectious or non-infectious diseases on the day of shipment per 9 CFR 91 regulations for U.S. livestock exportation.
