OVERVIEW

Plant Protection and Quarantine (PPQ) is a program within APHIS which safeguards U.S. agriculture and natural resources against the entry, establishment, and spread of economically and environmentally significant pests, and facilitates the safe trade of agricultural products. Join our team and gain valuable experience working in the field to stop this invasive species from harming our nation's agriculture.

This position serves a Training Specialist at the Professional Development Center (PDC), National Detector Dog Training Center (NDDTC). The incumbent designs, develops, delivers and evaluates training programs for Plant Protection and Quarantine (PPQ), Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service (APHIS), Department of Homeland Security (DHS) employees, and/or other stakeholders (i.e., federal, states department of agriculture, foreign ministries of agriculture, etc.).

This position may be filled as a **GS-09/11/12** multi-grade career ladder.

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- Applies instructional system design and adult learning theory to ensure that training is effective, consistent, legally defensible and cost beneficial.
- Utilizes a wide variety of instructional methods including technology-based methodologies.
- Delivers instruction on all facets (supervisory, trainer, handler) of detector dog team training to internal and external customers, ensures effective formation of new canine teams.
- Procures potential canines from various sources (i.e., public and private shelters, rescue groups, breeders, vendors and private owners).
- Performs canine temperament testing in real-world environments to determine if the canine is suitable for the PPQ detector dog training program.
- Develops written materials in a clear, convincing, and organized manner that meets established format and style standards and is appropriate for the intended audience.
- Serves as a consultant and troubleshooter for specific course content(s) or materials related to PPQ detector dog training programs.
