## Import of Scoured, Uncarded Animal Fiber into New Zealand

Fiber must:

- 1. The fiber must have been subjected to aqueous scouring at 60-70 degrees Celsius.
- 2. After scouring, the fiber must be: **EITHER** 
  - 2.1 dyed, **OR**
  - 2.2 further washed in water for at least 1 minute at a temperature of not less than 75 degrees C, **OR**
  - 2.3 dried at a minimum temperature of 70 degrees Celsius for at least 2 minutes.
- 3. The fiber must be derived from live animals resident in the country of origin or from animals that had been slaughtered in the country of origin to produce meat for human consumption.

## 4. **EITHER**

- 4.1 (a) The products must be derived from animals resident in a zone in which no case of foot and mouth disease has occurred within a 10 km radius within the last 30 days, and
  - (b) The products must be derived from holdings that have been free from foot and mouth disease for the previous 3 months.

## Or

- 4.2 The fiber is in transit at least 4 weeks to New Zealand.
- 5. On arrival in New Zealand the consignment must be directed to a transitional facility for further treatment.
