Certification Statements:

I, the undersigned USDA accredited veterinarian, hereby certify that the bird(s) described above meet the following requirements:

i. Infection with high pathogenicity avian influenza (HPAI) viruses is a notifiable disease in the United States.

ii. Regarding high pathogenicity avian influenza (HPAI):

[O] the country has been free from HPAI for the past 12 months prior to export.

[O] the country has been free from HPAI for the past twenty-eight (28 days) following a stamping out policy in accordance with Article 10.4.6. of WOAHP Terrestrial Animal Health Code.

[O] in the event of a HPAI outbreak, the birds are captive-bred and are not derived from farmed establishments originating from the areas that are within an HPAI-related restricted 10 km radius zone in the United States.

iii. The United States has been free from velogenic Newcastle Disease (ND) for the past six (6) months prior to export.

iv. The birds have been kept in isolation facilities approved by approved by the government veterinary authority since they were hatched, or for at least 28 days prior to shipment, and showed no clinical signs of infectious diseases including avian influenza, during the isolation period.

v. All birds, or a sample of birds from one consignment, were subject to the following tests within 14 days prior to export:

[O] Virus isolation test for avian influenza virus and the test results were negative.

[O] RT-PCR test for avian influenza virus and the test results were negative.

vi. The birds were examined today, within five (5) days of export, and found to be free from any clinical signs of infectious or contagious diseases.

vii. The birds will be transported in new or appropriately sanitized containers, according to IATA requirements.
