The hatching eggs have been cleaned and sanitized as soon as possible a) after collection using an approved-for-use sanitizing agent in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions. Hatching eggs have been packed in clean or appropriately sanitized shipping materials.

h) EITHER*

(1) Poultry (including their hatching eggs) for the purpose of this certificate is being defined as: birds of the following species: chickens, ducks, geese, grouse, guinea fowl, partridges, peafowl, pheasants, quail, pigeons and ratites. swans and turkeys;

- a) the production of: i) meat; ii) eggs for consumption; iii) other products;
- b) restocking supplies of game birds;
- c) the purpose of breeding of birds used for the types of production referred to in points (a) and (b).
