Certification Statements:

The undersigned USDA Accredited Veterinarian hereby certifies the following in relation to the animals described above:

1. The United States is free of foot and mouth disease, rinderpest, contagious bovine pleuropneumonia, and lumpy skin disease.

2. With respect to bovine spongiform encephalopathy (BSE):

- a. The United States is recognized by the World Organization for Animal Health (WOAH) as a country having a negligible risk status for bovine spongiform encephalopathy (BSE).
- b. The cattle selected for export are identified by a permanent identification system in such a way as to demonstrate that they are not exposed cattle.
- c. The cattle selected for export were born after the date from which the ban on the feeding of ruminants with meat-and-bone meal and greaves derived from ruminants was effectively enforced.

3. The herd of origin has been free of brucellosis and tuberculosis for the last 12 months.

4. Come from holdings which have been free from any official prohibition on health grounds, for the last 42 days in the case of brucellosis, for the last 30 days in the case of anthrax, for the last six months in the case of rabies, and have not been in contact with animals from holdings which did not satisfy these conditions.

5. On the establishment from which the animals originated, there have been no clinical cases of epizootic hemorrhagic disease for 12 months.

6. On the establishment from which the animals originated, there have been no clinical cases of vesicular stomatitis for 6 months.

7. On the establishment from which the animals originated, there have been no clinical cases of bluetongue disease for 12 months.

8. On the establishment from which the animals originated, there have been no clinical cases of paratuberculosis for 12 months.

9. For cows that have previously calved, the animals for export were inspected and found free from clinical signs of mycoplasma mastitis.

10. The animals were inspected within 30 days prior to export and found to be free from clinical evidence of communicable diseases.
