**Certification Statements:**

I, the undersigned USDA accredited veterinarian, acknowledge that the live animals of the above descriptions satisfy the following conditions:

1. The animals are from a country which has no case of Anthrax; OR the animals are from an establishment which has no record of anthrax for at least 20 days prior to export.
2. The animals are from a country where Ebola virus has not been recorded for at least 12 months.
3. The animals are from an establishment which has no record any case of Rabies for at least the last one (1) year prior to export.
4. The animals were treated for internal and external parasites within 14-21 days prior to export and have been sprayed with an insecticide approved by competent authority in the exporting country.
5. The record of the vaccinations administered to animals within the six months prior to export, are provided below.
6. The animals have been isolated for at least 30 days prior to export.
7. The animals for export have undergone laboratory tests for the detection of the following diseases: Simian immunodeficiency virus (SIV), Mycobacterium, tuberculosis (TB), Yellow Fever virus (YFV), Hepatitis B virus (HBV), Salmonella, Yersinia, Listeria, Marburg Hemorrhagic Fever (MHF), B virus (herpesvirus B, monkey B virus), and Monkeypox virus (mpox).
8. The animals have been visually examined by a USDA accredited veterinarian and have no clinical signs of measles; OR have been vaccinated for measles.
9. The animals have been clinically examined within (48) hours of export and have been found free of clinical signs of contagious and infectious diseases.
