Game Trophies

Fully treated (shelf stable) game trophies (any species):

There is no requirement for health certification for fully treated (shelf stable) game trophies, but the UK government recommends that consignments be accompanied by a commercial invoice or other commercial documentation. Reptile game trophies:

The United Kingdom does not require government certification (other than CITES) for game trophies of reptiles.

Partially treated or untreated game trophies of mammals other than ungulates:

UK importers wishing to import partially treated or untreated trophies from mammals other than ungulates should contact DEFRA to obtain an import license. Such a license should generally not require any animal health certification. Contact information for DEFRA follows:
