- 2. Have, as far as I can ascertain, either been continuously resident in the exporting country since birth or have been continuously resident in the exporting country or South Africa for the last six months.
- 3. Have been resident in licensed or registered zoos or wildlife parks in the exporting country for at least twelve (12) months immediately before certification or since birth.

- 7. Have been held under veterinary supervision in an approved pre-export facility that has been free of clinical symptoms of Rabies, Leishmania spp, herpesvirus and Salmonella spp infections for the last six (6) months prior to certification.
- 8. Originate from an area which is not under official veterinary restrictions by the Veterinary Authority of the exporting country, for any disease to which kinkajous are susceptible.
- 9. Did not, as far as is possible to determine, come into contact with animals infected or suspected of being infected with rabies.
- 10. Have a valid^{*1} rabies vaccination with an inactivated vaccine.

*1:

- The vaccine used must be a strain of anti-rabies conforming to a potency standard recognised by the World Health Organisation.
- The animal must have been vaccinated at least 30 days, but not longer than 12 months prior to export in the case of the primary vaccination.
- Animals under 3 months of age may not be vaccinated and are considered to have a valid vaccination provided the dam of the animal concerned was vaccinated at least 30 days, but not more than 12 months prior to giving birth. NB Such animals must be vaccinated at 3 months of age against rabies, in the Republic of South Africa and the owners must inform the South African Veterinary Authorities.
