<p>I hereby certify that following due enquiry and to the best of my knowledge and belief, the zoo birds covered under this health certificate have been inspected and comply with the following statements:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. The birds were not exposed to active cases of Newcastle disease on the premises where they were kept, or on adjoining premises, during the ninety (90) days immediately preceding export. 2. The birds either: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> A. Do not originate from a control zone established by the Canadian Food Inspection Agency (CFIA) due to outbreaks of Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza (HPAI) and are not currently under quarantine nor have any restrictions to their movement. OR B. Originate from a control zone established by the CFIA due to outbreaks of HPAI and arrangements have been made for quarantine after importation. The birds were not exposed to active cases of HPAI on the premises where they were kept, or on adjoining premises, during the twenty-eight (28) days immediately preceding export. <input type="checkbox"/> 3. The birds were examined within the thirty (30) days immediately preceding the date of export and showed no evidence of poultry communicable diseases. 4.
