2010 SUMMARY OF EQUINE INFECTIOUS ANEMIA CASES IN THE UNITED STATES

UPDATED APRIL 2012

This document summarizes State reporting of equine infectious anemia (EIA) cases in the United States during 2010. State animal health officials report EIA testing and case information to APHIS Veterinary Services (VS) through the National Animal Health Reporting System (NAHRS). The NAHRS is an online reporting tool enabling States to submit animal disease information to VS by the Internet with assurance of secure data transfer and information confidentiality. Thirty-five States used this system for EIA reporting in 2010. The National Surveillance Unit requested EIA information by e-mail from States that did not use NAHRS, and recorded the data in the NAHRS database.




Figure 1. Reported numbers of horses and premises testing positive for EIA, 2010

In calendar year 2010, the States reported **49 horses** on **32 premises** as confirmed positive for EIA. Altogether, a total of 1,681,570 EIA tests were conducted. Table 1 shows the number of EIA tests and positive case totals for each State, and Figure 1 is a map of U.S. EIA cases in 2010. Figure 2 shows trends in numbers of EIA tests and positive horses from 2001 through 2010.
